IMPORTANT UPCOMING EVENTS

Your student will be sent home with a packet with important forms to be completed by guardians. Please make sure to read and sign all relevant forms. *Please return all forms to the school office during the first week of school*.

SAFETY/SECURITY

For the safety of our staff, students, and school community, please use the student drop off/pick up area located on LaVenture Road - west side of the building. Students riding the bus will load/unload in the bus zone located in the north parking lot near Section Street. Additionally, construction of a new fence and gate will begin soon to provide increased security on our campus. Access from the north side will be limited to students entering before and after school. The gate will be locked during school hours. For visitors during school hours, a buzzer system, on the wall next to the main entrance, will be utilized during school hours. All visitors must use the buzzer when visiting campus.

VALUABLES (Cell Phones, etc.)

Inappropriate use of electronic devices disrupts the learning environment and is disrespectful of others who share our community of learners. Please see the student planner for complete guidelines, but briefly:

Personal electronic devices may not be used during school hours (7am-2pm) or they will be collected by an adult and placed in the office until after school. (All rules and consequences are in our handbook that will be in your student's planner given on the first day of school.)
