2019-2020 WAIVER INFORMATION

Waivers for 2019-20 School Year - In the MVSD, all students are assigned to a "home" school based on their address. If parents want their child to attend a different school within the district, they must submit a "School Change Within the MVSD" form (or a "waiver form") and submit it *to the school they are requesting to attend* (If a student is assigned to LaVenture but wishes to attend Mount Baker, the waiver form goes to Mount Baker, and vice-versa). Both middle schools require that any student wishing to waiver into a school other than their home school submit a waiver request form in order to be considered for a change in schools.

You can get a "School Change Within the MVSD" form online at the MVSD website under the tab "forms". For more information on our waiver protocol, you can go to the LaVenture or Mount Baker website, contact the school directly, or forms may be picked up at either school.

Students currently waivered into either middle school <u>must complete a waiver request yearly</u>. Students are not automatically enrolled into their current school.

Students currently enrolled as <u>6th and 7th graders</u> at either MBMS or LVMS, in the 2018-19 school year <u>who wish to change schools for the 2019-20 school year</u> must submit waiver requests <u>no later than June 17, 2019</u> to the school into which they desire to transfer. These requests will receive consideration, dependent upon the student's behavioral, attendance and academic standing at their previous school, as well as space available. Schools will respond to all waiver requests by June 28, 2019.

Students currently enrolled as <u>6th and 7th graders</u> at either middle school who have been reassigned to a new school for 2019-20, must complete a waiver request if they wish to remain in their present school. The request is due <u>no later than June 17.</u> <u>2019</u> to the school they desire to attend. Schools will respond to all waiver requests by June 28, 2019.

Students currently enrolled as 5th graders at any elementary school in the MVSD must submit waiver requests <u>no later than</u> <u>June 17, 2019</u>. These requests will receive consideration, dependent upon the student's behavioral, attendance and academic standing at their previous school, as well as space available. Schools will respond to all waiver requests by June 28, 2019.

COUNSELING CORNER

End of year wrap up from the counseling office:

If your family has not already signed the College Bound Scholarship form and your 8th grade student is eligible, they will be receiving a form through homecourt. This scholarship is an opportunity for students to access financial support for colleges and technical programs throughout Washington. Please check which boxes apply, and make sure students return the form to their homecourt teacher or the Mount Baker front office. Students need to fill out the College Bound Scholarship form by the end of their 8th grade year. You can also fill out the form online at https://readysetgrad.wa.gov/college/College-Bound-Sign-Up
